PREACHER FEATURE

"For it is better to suffer from doing right, if that should be God's will, than for doing wrong." -1 Peter 3:17

Baseball season is well under way. There will be a lot of pitches hurled at home plate this season, and every one of them will have to travel the sixty foot, six inch distance from the mound to the plate. But in times past, that distance was quite a bit shorter.

Initially, the distance from the mound to home plate was only forty-five feet. It was moved back to fifty feet in 1881. The reason for the change had to do with the fact that, as pitchers developed faster pitches, batters had a harder time hitting them, which resulted in a more boring game of baseball. So, the mound was moved to make balls easier to hit.

In 1893, overhand pitching was legalized in pro baseball. Once again, because the speed of the pitch was greatly increased, it became a lot harder to get a hit. And again, to make it easier, the mound was then officially moved back to a distance of sixty feet, six inches. Again, more hits, more action and more excitement.

How did they decide on that sixty feet, six inch distance? Well, it was supposed to be only sixty feet. The current distance actually was the result of a misread architectural drawing that specified 60' 0". The final zero was poorly written and taken for a six.

There's no doubt that the baseball folks did the right thing. What's baseball without hits? Besides, considering the speed of today's average pitch, it's still plenty hard to get a hit. It takes a lot of skill, and few are those who can do it really well.

While moving the mound is fine for baseball, it's not the right thing to do in every instance. Sometimes, when doing the right thing in life seems to get tough, we want to "move the mound" and make it easier. Most of the time, this means lowering the standards. It means compromising. It means forsaking our convictions for convenience. It sometimes involves embracing the fads and fashions of the world and abandoning the timeless truths of God's word.

The mistake we make is in thinking that the easy things are always easier. Sometimes, choosing what seems to be expedient over what, deep inside, we know to be right, results in some really hard consequences.

The Bible teaches us that the suffering we may endure from choosing what is right is always preferable to choosing wrong. Unless we're playing a game of baseball, we ought to think twice before moving the mound.



FATHER'S DAY

Sunday, June 19

Father's Day is a celebration of fathers inaugurated in the early twentieth century to complement Mother's Day in celebrating fatherhood and male parenting. It is also celebrated to honor and commemorate our forefathers. Father's Day is celebrated on a variety of dates worldwide and typically involves gift-giving, special dinners to fathers, and family-oriented activities.

On June 19, 1910, an independently-invented Father's Day observance was celebrated through the efforts of Sonora Smart Dodd of Spokane, Washington. After listening to a church sermon at Spokane's Central Methodist Episcopal Church in 1909 about the newly recognized Mother's Day, Dodd felt strongly that fatherhood needed recognition, as well. She wanted a celebration that honored fathers like her own father, William Smart, a Civil War veteran who was left to raise his family alone when his wife died giving birth to their sixth child when Sonora was 16 years old.

The following year with the assistance of Reverend Dr. Conrad Bluhm, her pastor at Old Centenary Presbyterian Church (now Knox Presbyterian Church), Sonora took the idea to the Spokane YMCA. The Spokane YMCA, along with the Ministerial Alliance, endorsed Dodd's idea and helped it spread by celebrating the first Father's Day in 1910. Sonora suggested her father's birthday, June 5, be established as the day to honor all Fathers. However, the pastors wanted more time to prepare, so on June 19, 1910, young members of the YMCA went to church wearing roses: a red rose to honor a living father, and a white rose to honor a deceased one. Dodd traveled through the city in a horse-drawn carriage, carrying gifts to shut-in fathers confined indoors by illness.

It took many years to make the holiday official. In spite of support from the YWCA, the YMCA, and churches, Father's Day ran the risk of disappearing from the calendar. Where Mother's Day was met with enthusiasm, Father's Day was often met with laughter. The holiday was gathering attention slowly, but for the wrong reasons. It was the target of much satire, parody and derision, including jokes from the local newspaper Spokesman-Review. Many people saw it as the first step in filling the calendar with mindless promotions.

A bill to accord national recognition of the holiday was introduced in Congress in 1913. In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson went to Spokane to speak in a Father's Day celebration and wanted to make it official, but Congress resisted, fearing that it would become commercialized. US President Calvin Coolidge recommended in 1924 that the day be observed by the nation, but stopped short of issuing a national proclamation. Two earlier attempts to formally recognize the holiday had been defeated by Congress. In 1957, Maine Senator Margaret Chase Smith wrote a proposal accusing Congress of ignoring fathers for 40 years while honoring mothers, thus "[singling] out just one of our two parents" In 1966, President Lyndon B. Johnson issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father's Day. Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President Richard Nixon signed it into law in 1972.

First observance. Contrary to popular belief, the first observance of Father's Day actually took place in Fairmont, West Virginia on July 5, 1908. It was organized by Mrs. Grace Golden Clayton, who wanted to celebrate the lives of the 210 fathers who had been lost in the Monongah Mining disaster several months earlier in Monongah, West Virginia, on December 6, 1907. It's possible that Clayton was influenced by the first celebration of Mother's Day that same year, just a few miles away. Clayton chose the Sunday nearest to the birthday of her recently deceased father.

MUSIC/ADULT MINISTRY

Last night I attended the last monthly meeting for this year of the Sarasota-Manatee Chapter of the American Guild of Organists. We first met in the fellowship hall for a wonderful banquet, and then we moved into the sanctuary of the St. Armand's Key Lutheran Church for the worship service, which included the installation of officers. Meeting with musicians who do what I do is always stimulating, and I welcome the opportunity to exchange information and ideas to enhance worship with music. Our guest speaker was Dr. Paul Westermeyer, who holds degrees in both music and theology and is on the faculty of St. Olaf's College.

The idea that impressed me most about his speech was this: we musicians have the charge of leading people in music; we help both the congregation and choir to proclaim by means of song the Good News which can manifest itself in the vocalises of "laughing" before God and "groaning" in our prayers of petition. Together with the clergy, we have a high calling to gather the body of believers, telling the world of God's message through the WORD with our words of praise and prayer. Dr. Westermeyer said, "The church lives for music and the glory of God and edification of humanity."

I was most touched by the concluding prayer: "Source of all that is good and true and beautiful, to whom whales and birds and crickets sing, keep constant in your musicians the conviction that you Spirit works through them to reach a vast and varied host of souls who gather in church for hope, assurance, grace, beauty - for some sign of your care, for solace from grief and loss, for strength to stand for justice, for a glimpse of wonder and mystery, for response to a need so hidden that it is known to you alone. Assure your musicians that the rehearsals they lead, the anthems they conduct, the hymns they play, the psalms they accompany, the service music they offer, the solos they sing, the instrumental works they perform, the programs they organize, the words of encouragement they give are again and again the vessel of your Spirit for healing the bruised, the lost, the broken and for setting free the holy aspirations of the human heart. May the unarticulated gratitude of the souls that are saved be borne to the heart of your musicians as a gift to renew their faith so that they may continue to be instruments of proclamation and pastoral care as they led your people in singing your everlasting praise - through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

Praying this prayer has given me renewed strength of purpose. May God bless our musicians at St. Johns and the congregation we serve.

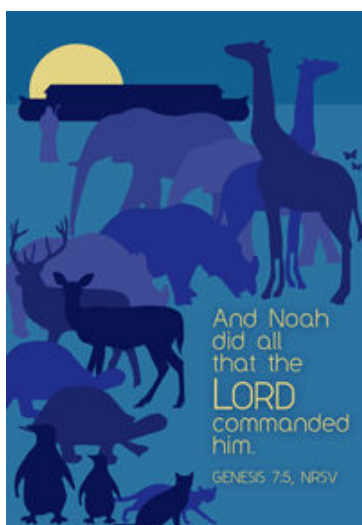

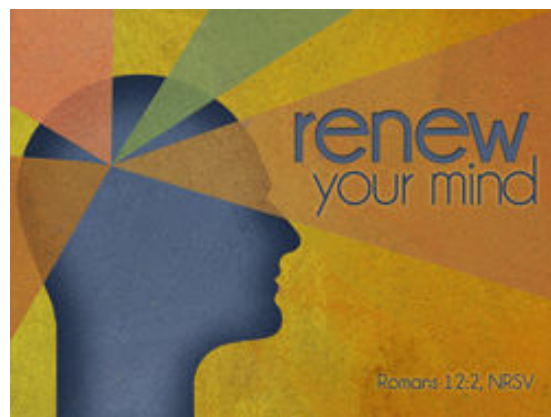
